The BC Centre for Disease Control

(BCCDC) is working with provincial and federal partners on surveillance, diagnostic testing and infection control measures in response to the global COVID-19 pandemic. Resources are continuously updated and made available online and include guidelines, signage and posters, and handouts.

Resources for <u>health-care professionals</u> available on BCCDC's website include:

- <u>Clinical guidance</u> on the care of patients during the pandemic and management of patients with COVID-19. Guidance and information is available for primary care, pediatrics, pregnancy, surgical care and more. New information is regularly added to the site as new guidelines are developed and others revised.
- <u>Patient handouts</u> Downloadable handouts can be printed for patients who are being tested, selfisolating and/or monitoring for symptoms of COVID-19.
- <u>Signage and posters</u> for a variety of health-care settings, topics include: <u>hand hygiene</u>, <u>putting on</u> <u>personal protective equipment (donning)</u> and <u>removing personal protective equipment</u> (<u>doffing</u>).

- Testing and laboratory guidance Testing is available for all patients who need it. B.C. is currently testing all individuals who have cold, influenza or COVID-19-like symptoms, however mild.
- <u>Guidance for long-term care homes and seniors'</u>
 assisted living including the use of personal
 protective equipment, screening for symptoms,
 <u>visitors</u>, personal service providers, cleaning and
 transfers.
